What to Bring?

What NOT to Bring?

The following items are not permitted at Camp Rudolph:

- ◇ Cell phones
- ◇ Electronic devices such as but not limited to ipods, ipads, mp3 players, hand held video games
- ◇ Drugs, alcohol or weapons
- ◇ Fireworks
- ◇ Inappropriate clothing
- ◇ Food to be kept in the dorms

Lost & Found

Please be sure to label your camper's belongings. We are not responsible for lost or stolen items. The camp will hold lost and found items for 30 days after the session it is found. If unclaimed it is donated or disposed of. If your camper loses an item please email or call the camp office with a description of the item and a plan for recovering it. If shipping is requested, parents are asked to cover the cost.

Camp Rules

It should be understood that at a Christian Camp, Christian conduct shall govern all activities. The following rules are expectations of every camper. Failure to comply may result in dismissal from camp without refund. Parents are responsible for making their camper aware of these rules.

1. All clothing should be modest and decent. Please leave the following items at home: all tank tops, shirts with low cut necklines, spaghetti straps, bare midriffs, jogging shorts, short dresses, leggings, yoga pants, shorts that are shorter than fingertip length or two-piece swimwear. Men and boys must wear shirts at all times, except while swimming. Shoes should be worn at all times!!!
2. Cell phones and all electronic devices are not permitted. If a camper is found with one it will be confiscated, placed in the office and returned at check-out.
3. Campers who destroy camp property (buildings, equipment, vehicles, grounds, etc.) will be responsible for the cost of repair or replacement. Please no writing on walls, tables, bunks, benches, etc.
4. The use of tobacco, alcohol, undesirable language, any narcotics, weapons, firearms, or fireworks is forbidden.
5. Automobiles driven to camp by campers must be parked and locked, to remain that way throughout the session. Keys should be turned in during check-in to be stored in the office.
6. All sickness and injury must be reported to the camp first aid staff immediately. Sick children are not to be brought to camp. Anyone running a fever above 101° during the 24 hours prior to the session, should stay home.
7. Everyone is expected to follow the daily camp schedule.
8. Campers cannot receive/make phone calls except in cases of emergency. If there is an emergency please call the office.

Camp Rudolph is a Peanut & Tree-nut Free Facility

Please help keep our campers safe! Please do not bring or send any candy, or food with nuts or processed in a facility that uses nuts for your camper.

Remember food is not allowed to be stored in the dorms.

Mail Call

Every camper looks forward to receiving mail from family and friends. When addressing letters, please include the camper's name and session of camp they are attending. Send mail to:

You may send mail early to guarantee the camper will receive it. It will be held in the office until their session. You may also drop off mail at Check-in or write notes at our Note Writing Station.

Free e-mails may be sent via your online registration account. Simply log into your online account during your child's stay to send unlimited, free e-mails. Please do not send e-mail messages for campers to the camp e-mail addresses. They WILL NOT be printed or delivered.

Daily care packages are available for purchase. Each day at mail call your camper will receive a note from you along with camp theme gift items.

Checking in

Please do not arrive more than 30 minutes before the listed check-in time, this allows the camp staff and volunteers uninterrupted preparation time. We want everything to be ready for your camper!! Check-in is in the Cavalier Building. **You may not enter the dorms before checking in.**

What to expect during check-in:

- ~ Any balance owed is due
- ~ Canteen, t-shirts and other fun camp extras can be purchased
- ~ A copy of your camper's insurance card will be requested, please bring a copy or have the card ready to be copied.
- ~ Campers with a cell phone will be expected to turn it in to be kept in the office, or send it home with parents.
- ~ A completed Camper Health Check form will be requested. If not received, a trained volunteer will do a brief health check.
- ~ **All medication and any essential oils will need to be turned in to the first aid staff. All medications *must* be packaged in their original containers with the camper's name and instructions. *Please no pill boxes or bags with pills.***

Once your child has checked in and received a wristband, you may assist him or her to the dorm to set-up the bunk they choose, then you are free to leave when you are ready.

Summer Missions

- All 2018 campers will be working on the same Missions goal. This year's goal is to raise \$5,000 to help a local organization e3 Restoration, which seeks



the change the narrative on homelessness.

Checking out

- For the safety of our campers we require everyone to be signed out before departure. This is to help ensure that unauthorized persons are not picking up your camper. Please inform the office of persons you authorize to pick-up your camper if you are unable to do so.
- Please wait until the check-out time to pick-up your camper, if at all possible. That way they don't feel like they have missed anything. If you must pick-up your camper early, please notify the camp office by phone 434-535-8147 or email office@camprudolph.org so we can let the leaders know to help your camper get ready.
- Check-out will be in the Cavalier building unless otherwise designated by signs upon arrival.

What to expect at check-out:

- ~ A parent or other authorized persons will sign the check-out form
- ~ Your camper will receive a camp group photo
- ~ Pick-up your camper medications
- ~ Check the lost and found table for any missing items.
- Once your camper is checked out please proceed to the dorm to retrieve their belongings. Have a safe drive home and come see us again SOON!!

New this year! Meet Waldo, a fun app that sends photos of YOUR camper directly to YOUR phone each day of the camp session. It's just a small fee each week that benefits the GGG Scholarship fund. Look for sign up details about a week before the session or at check-in.
